Dr. Sandra Cassotta



Dr. Cassotta is an Associate Professor in International, Environmental and Energy Law at Aalborg University (Denmark). She was appointed Lead Author on Environmental Governance and Polar Regions at the International Panel of Climate Change at the United Nations. She specializes in environmental damage and liability problems in a multilevel context and on environmental regime effectiveness in a multi-level governance perspective.

Dr. Hiroyuki Enomoto



Dr. Enomoto is a Professor at the Arctic Environment Research Center, National Institute of Polar Research (NIPR) and Professor at the Department of Polar Studies at the Graduate University for Advanced Studies, Japan. His research focuses on cryospheric and climatic changes. Since 2014, he has been vice director-general of NIPR. He has also been working as the leading member of the Japanese Arctic research project, and with international cryospheric and Arctic meetings; a lead author for IPCC SROCC (Special report on Ocean and Cryosphere in the changing climate, released in 2019). Since 2020, he is the vice-president of IASC (International Arctic Science Committee). He is also the Project Director of Japan's flagship Arctic research project: Arctic Challenge for Sustainability II (ArCS II) that started in 2020.
